

## Year 2 2022-23 Autumn Term 1 Newsletter

Welcome to Year 2! The class teacher in Year 2 is Mrs Ferris and the Teaching Assistant is Ms O'Sullivan.

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### Maths

Our first topic in Maths will be place value. We will begin by looking closely at the place value of digits and how numbers can be represented in different ways using practical equipment. To aid our understanding we will use Base 10, place value straws, arrow cards and money. It is very important that the children are confident when discussing the value of digits in numbers. Following this we will move on to learning how to measure length and mass (weight) accurately and naming 2D and 3D shapes and studying their properties.

Year 2 children are expected to know their 2s, 5s, 10s and 3 times tables.

### P.E:

In PE we are having coaching from Rossendale Leisure trust who will be looking at the Fundamental Skills of throwing and catching. Please ensure your child's PE kit is in school for these lessons.

### Topic / Creative Curriculum

Our Topic this half term is 'The Place Where I Live'. In **Geography** we will be looking at our school and surrounding area. We will be looking at and creating our own maps and even completing some field work.

In **Music** we will be learning to sing a range of songs, keeping the steady beat and learning to play the glockenspiels.

In **Art** we are looking at the artist Friedensreich Hundertwasser and completing a mono-print based on our local studies.

### English

We will begin the half term by looking at the story 'Traction Man is Here'. We will be making predictions about characters and events before creating our own Traction Man adventure. During this unit we will focus on noun phrases, time adverbials, commas in a list and adverbs. Following this, we will be writing instructions linked to the Traction Man text and also writing an information text linked to our Science topic 'Everyday Materials'.

Spellings will be handed out on a Monday and the children will be tested on a Friday.

Reading books will be changed on a **Monday, Wednesday** and **Friday**.

A library book will come home with the children on a Monday and will be changed every Monday.

### R.E

This half term our main question is 'The Bible- Why is it such a special book?' Within this unit the children will deepen their understanding of the Bible, its contents, presentation and importance to Christians. We will also begin to develop an understanding of holy books from other faiths other than Christianity and their significance in the lives of believers.

### P.S.H.E

In PSHE we will be looking at the unit 'Me and My Relationships'. Within this unit we will be looking at our ideal classroom, why we need rules, feelings, how to be a good friend and different types of bullying and how to deal with it. The children will enjoy a range of stories, circle times and activities.

### Science

In Science, our topic is 'Everyday Materials.' Children will be identifying and describing the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. We will be learning a range of new scientific vocabulary and applying them to fun investigations that will link to our class text 'Traction Man'.

### Computing

This half term we will be completing a unit of work on coding. The children will learn that an algorithm is a set of instructions that are needed to complete a task. The children will then explore creating their own algorithms and solve any issues created in an algorithm. Then children will then evaluate their completed algorithm.

### Ideas to help your child at home:

- Read at home with your child as often as possible. The children will collect stickers in their reading rainbow and will get to swap it for a prize when the chart is full.
- Homework is set at the beginning of the term and is to be completed once a week. Your child can bring their homework in to school when completed and will be given house points and a chance to show the class their work.
- By the end of Year 2 we need to know our 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables. Any practise at home would be really useful.

### Things to remember:

- Homework will be set at the beginning of every half term and will be collected in weekly.
- P.E. kits in school for P.E. at all times, usually taught on a Wednesday.
- Correct uniform to be worn all the time, including school shoes. Please notify school of any issues Please can names be put in all uniform.
