

Our Friends volunteers are meeting this afternoon to plan the next fundraisers. This is in church with a cuppa; all are welcome to come along.





Christian Value




This half term's Christian value which we are focussing on is 'Hope'.


Punctuality

Please ensure your child is in school and ready to learn by 9:00 am.

Our school gates are open at **8:45 am** for your child to arrive and settle into their class routines for learning to begin at 9:00 am. School gates will be locked promptly. **This is an important part of the school day and it can cause unnecessary upset when a child arrives part way through a lesson.** A 'late mark' also contributes to your child's overall attendance figure.

Breakfast club is available from 7:45 am.

Parking

























Forest School Dates
