


Punctuality

Please ensure your child is in school and ready to learn by 9:00 am.

Our school gates are open at **8:45 am** for your child to arrive and settle into their class routines for learning to begin at 9:00 am. School gates will be locked promptly. **This is an important part of the school day and it can cause unnecessary upset when a child arrives part way through a lesson. A 'late mark' also contributes to your child's overall attendance figure.**

- not to double park near the pull in laybys.


Ash Wednesday


Forest School Dates


Friends of St Anne's
