
### **ThisOur Values**

Also next week, our dance troupe will perform at the annual dance competition. We wish them all the very best and are grateful for the staff that have coached them and those that will accompany them on this visit.




### **Punctuality**

Breakfast club is available from 7:45 am.



not to park on the yellow safety lines around school,


- not to turn around in the road and reverse near pavements,



### Welcome to St Anne's Church Edgeside




**St Anne's Church** is made up of an active group of people who love God and want to serve our Community. Our services are modern and informal and we love to get everyone involved.
