School Uniform Policy

This policy intends to outline the intent of St Anne's school uniform to ensure that:

- pupils look smart,
- pupils represent St Anne's school in a positive light,
- pupils can access curriculum lessons well,
- our approach to requiring a uniform is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- expectations for school uniform are clear to parent/carers and are consistent
- uniform cost is the same for all pupils.

While this policy refers to male and female, it is in place with consideration to the equality act. Where a child may identify as male/female then pupils may wear their choice of uniform with St Anne's colours as outlined below.

Similarly, where there is a pupil who requires support in purchasing school uniform, St Anne's will provide this in communication with the parent/carer.

St Anne's uniform expectations

Female:

- Grey skirt, trousers or shorts
- White polo shirt
- Bottle green cardigan or sweatshirt
- Green gingham dress for summer (optional)

Male:

- Grey trousers or shorts
- White polo shirt
- Bottle green cardigan or sweatshirt

Footwear:

- All children are required to wear black, rubber soled school shoes. Not trainers.
- All pupils also need black indoor slip-on pumps or trainers for PE

Our PE kit is as follows:

- Black shorts – logo and non logo option. These need to be the loose fitting type short not the cycling, Nike pro type.
- Green t shirt – logo and non logo option
- 1/4 zip sweat shirt – logo
- Black joggers – logo and non logo for cooler weather
- Black trainers (pumps will not suffice being worn all day)
- Black, white or grey socks

Parents/carers are responsible for ensuring their child is dressed appropriately for school and for PE on their PE days.

For non logo options, supermarkets and Amazon stock black shorts, green t shirts and black jogger type trousers.

Forest School Clothing:

- Waterproof coat (or waterproof jacket in warmer weather)
- Comfortable tracksuit bottoms or leggings (not shorts)
- Long-sleeved top
- Wellington boots or old trainers
- Appropriate hat for the weather /scarf and gloves (in colder weather)

To note, forest school sessions often entail mud, climbing and exploring so clothes for these sessions may return home dirty or marked.

Parents/carers are responsible for ensuring that their child is dressed appropriately for forest school to enable their child to access the session safely and to avoid spoiling normal school uniform

- Please ensure that any items of clothing, which your child is likely to remove or put on during the school day, are clearly named.
- School cannot accept responsibility for lost clothing or items.
- Clothing and footwear are the responsibility of the pupil and not the school.
- If a child goes home in another child's clothing by accident, for example, their sweatshirt, parents/carers should send the clothing not belonging to them back into school to their child's class teacher.

Where to purchase school uniform

- Ann's School Wear – 5a Union Street, Bacup, OL12 0AA
- Any local supermarket for items without the school logo.

Jewellery

Only the following items of jewellery can be worn in school:

- A wristwatch – this should not be a SMART watch. Mobile devices are not allowed in school and should be taken to the office where a parental form needs to be completed.
- Pupils may wear a small pair of earring studs, but these will need to be covered or removed for certain activities like PE. These should be plain silver or gold metal studs.

- Jewellery of any other description is not permitted. This includes holiday bracelets which should be removed before children return to school.

Hair and Headwear

- Pupils are requested to tie long hair up using a bobble. A small, green coloured 'scrunchie' type bobble can be worn in line with St Anne's colours.
- No large bows, headbands, 'ears' are to be worn.

Water Bottles

Children should bring a water bottle into school each day. This should:

- Have a retractable non-spill top
- Be labelled with their name
- Contain **water** only (no juice or cordial)

If child doesn't not wear correct school uniform St Anne's will:

- Engage with parent/carer via text or phone call to remind about school's expectations to ensure correct uniform is worn
- If uniform is still not correct, telephone/meet with parent/carer to offer support e.g. early help from school and understand why uniform expectations are not being met
- In some cases, St Anne's will provide the necessary pieces of uniform to support a family in meeting the uniform expectations

This policy will be reviewed annually by the headteacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
